## ARE YOU DRESSED CORRECTLY? HORSE RIDING GEAR:

#### **PARENTS PLEASE NOTE:**

Safety is an important part of riding horses and the gear and clothing is designed to help you be more comfortable and most importantly to keep you safe. Everything is expensive these days and we do not expect you to go rushing out and spend all your money on riding gear right off the bat, but a hard hat is imperative, as well as the correct shoes. As soon as your child decides that this is a sport that they would like to go further in, it's a very good idea to invest in the first three things on the below list.

Chartwell Stables does have some gear that our newer riders are welcome to borrow, but we do encouraging all of our riders to get kitted out in horse riding gear as soon as you can.

Horse riding gear is designed for the protection of the rider and thus is an important part of the sport. Below is a list of three necessary items that the rider must have:

Riding Hat: This is the most important piece of equipment for the rider !- their is no

price that you can put forward to protect your child's head!

There are various tack shops where you can purchase a quality horse riding

helmet. - Please ask your instructor for advice.

Boots: are also very important as they are designed with a small heel so that feet are

less likely to get stuck in the stirrups in the case of a fall.

Tackies are unsafe and too wide! If you don't have boots then school

shoes with a small heel and no buckles will do the trick.

**Jodhpurs:** are designed to fit close to the legs so that no rubbing occurs.

More on gear:

Chaps: These fit over the lower leg and boot and help to keep the leg still when riding. Whips: These are good to have in case you need them (depending on the horse that

you will ride). There are different types. The one you will need is a riding stick or crop. You do not need a dressage whip. We do not encourage smacking our ponies! But sometimes on a hot day they may need a small tap tap on the

shoulder.

Spurs: These are NOT needed at this stage of riding.

T-shirt: Golf shirts are best as these are smart and make you look the part. Chartwell

have their own branded shirts which you may order. Speak to your instructor.

Hair: should ALWAYS be tied up and out of the way when riding.

Jewellery: should not be worn. Jewellery can get stuck or caught and can cause injury.

We like to encourage our riders to look the part and be a good ambassador for their sport.
