RIDING HORSES ON ROADS

When we ride our horses and ponies on roads, whether there is traffic or not, there are some very important rules that you need to remember:

- WHAT TO WEAR: Hard Hat, reflective clothing is a must if you are riding at night.
- WHAT TO TAKE WITH YOU: Cellphone with emergency number and stable number, and any personal medication like an asthma pump.
- WHAT TO CHECK: your tack to ensure that everything is buckled correctly and safe.

IMPORTANT POINTS TO REMEMBER:

- Plan your route and get permission to ride on land if need be.
- Put the most experienced rider and steady horse in the lead.
- Ride in Single File two abreast if need be but never more than that.
- Ride with the traffic, and always check behind you and look left and right before doing anything; especially speeding up or slowing down. Obey traffic lights!
- Thank drivers for slowing down! Curtesy is key: be polite always, do not mess with livestock and close gates that you have to open.
- The leader should always tell the ride before going faster or slowing down.
- Pedestrians and cars have right of way so take note of them many people are scared
 of horses so be aware that they don't do anything that would scare your horse and
 maybe re-assure them.
- If you are riding with strangers and your horse is prone to kicking, tie a red ribbon in the top of his tail.

HOW TO RIDE AROUND A HAZZARD CORRECTLY:

- Slow to a walk, and have a guick look around for the traffic.
- If there is no traffic reassure horse, otherwise wait for the traffic to pass first.
- Bend him away from the hazard with the hand and leg so that his head is turned away from the object and the hindquarters do not swing into the traffic.
- Be determined and not scared. Walk your horse past the hazzard.
- Keep going so that people behind you can get past
- Never shout or scream with fun or fear on a ride. This will only make your horse more nervous. Never Panic!

If someone falls off during the ride, don't panic. Everyone dismounts and holds their horse and the loose horse away from the fallen person. Phone for help.

If the loose horse runs away phone the yard to warn them that it may return. Do not chase it.
